NOMINATIVE:

Subject **Brock** is a major dude.
Predicate Nominative Brock is a **major dude**.
Predicate Adjective Brock is **way cool**.

GENITIVE:

Possession Brock's pad (the pad **of Brock**) is a bit on the messy side.
Objective Brock has a love **of the DP**.
Partitive Most of Brock's stuff (**of the stuff** of Brock) is right here.
Description The dude is a man **of great serenity**.

DATIVE:

Indirect Object They gave (to) **Brock** a round of snaps.
Reference Brock will go the extra distance **for a friend**.
Purpose With Brock, the usual rules of society act as (for) **a hindrance**.
Double (Purp+Ref) Probably, Brock was (for) **a worry** to **his parents**.
w/ Adjectives Brock is friendly **to everyone**.
Possession (w/ sum) Back off, man! That DP is **for the Brockster**.
Agent (w/ fut.pass.part.) The job was to be done **by Brock** by Thursday.

ACCUSATIVE:

Direct Object I love **that dude**.
Double (w/ rogo, doceo) Brock taught **me yoga**.
Time Duration Brock worked at the Stewart House **for two years**.
Place Toward This weekend Brock is going to **another blues festival**.

ABLATIVE - preposition?:

Separation – N It is not advised to keep Brock **from his DP**.
Cause – N I visit regularly **from a deep, abiding love** of the Brockman.
Place From – Y I am driving **away from Brock's restaurant** right now. ab, de, ex
Agent (w/ passive) – Y That DP was sure sucked down quick **by the Brockmeister**. ab
Means – N Brock hit me **with his rhythm stick**.
Price – N Brock sold his beater **for mucho dinero**.
Degree of Difference – N Brock is way cooler (cooler **by much**) than most old guys.
Specification – N I yield to Brock in **laidbackness**.
Description – N The dude is an hombre **of mighty importance**.
Accompaniment – Y I dig going anywhere **with Brock**. cum
Manner – Y Brock lives life **with a vengeance**. cum
Time When – N Brock should get here **at 7 am** (AM?! What, are you kidding? PM!)
Place Where – Y Brock is **in the house**. in
Absolute – N **All things having been said**, I repeat: Brock is a major, major dude.

Direct Address "**Brock!** What up?"
