Latin 2 Mr. Arwe Extra Credit Project – 1st Quarter

Poster (exactly 14" x 22") on Roman Architecture

Make a poster describing some example of Roman architecture (e.g. Coliseum, Pantheon, Temple of Castor and Pollux, etc.). Topics must be preapproved. The poster should include both text and pictures and a map showing the location of the structure. You may use your own art work, photographs, magazine pictures, or other depictions.

Grading Criteria (equal to one test grade):

Layout, use of color, knowledge of material, clarity of display, ability to follow directions, accuracy and extent of historical information.

Latin 2 Mr. Arwe Extra Credit Project – 2nd Quarter

Poster (exactly 14" x 22") on a Roman historical figure

Make a poster describing a Roman historical figure (e.g. Cato, Octavius, Tacitus, Livia, Agrippina, etc., but NOT Caesar) and his or her historical significance. Topics must be preapproved. The poster should include both text and pictures and a timeline of Roman history with an indication of when your historical figure lived. You may use your own art work, clip art, photographs, magazine pictures, or other depictions.

Grading Criteria (equal to one test grade):

Layout, use of color, knowledge of material, clarity of display, ability to follow directions, accuracy and extent of historical information.

Latin 2 Mr. Arwe Extra Credit Project – 3rd Quarter

Poster (exactly 14" x 22") on Roman Mythology

Make a poster describing some aspect of a Roman mythological figure. Topics <u>must</u> be preapproved. The poster should include both text and pictures and a family tree indicating your mythological figure's parents and children. You may use your own art work, clip art, photographs, magazine pictures, or other depictions.

Grading Criteria (equal to <u>one</u> test grade):

Layout, use of color, knowledge of material, clarity of display, ability to follow directions, accuracy and extent of information.

Latin 2 Mr. Arwe Extra Credit Project - 4th Quarter

Model (no bigger than 18" by 18") on some aspect of Roman History

Make a three-dimensional model from whatever materials you want (e.g. popsicle sticks, wood, clay, sculpy, metal, plaster of Paris, Styrofoam) of some Roman artifact, building, location, or event. Topics must be <u>preapproved</u>.

Examples: artifact (siege engine) building (Coliseum) location (the Roman Forum) event (eruption of Mt. Vesuvius)

Grading Criteria (equal to one test grade):

Effort, knowledge of material, use of color, accuracy and extent of historical information depicted.
